TROPICAL HIBISCUS

CARE INSTRUCTIONS

Perfect for
Patios & Decks!

EXPOSURE

They need lots and lots of light. They do best in full sun. Hibiscus are very sensitive to temps below 50 degrees and thrive in temps from 60-85 degrees.

WATERING

As soon as the soil begins to dry, thoroughly drench the root mass. Keeping the soil evenly moist is important during the summer when they are blooming. If they are kept in the pots, in full sun, they should be watered every 1 to 2 days. AVOID OVER - WATERING!!

DEAD-HEADING

In order to get the maximum amount of blooms from your hibiscus, you must remove the spent flowers. This will promote more blooms.

FERTILIZING

Hibiscus are heavy feeders when they are actively growing and blooming. They can be fed every other week during the summer and spring with an all purpose, water soluble fertilizer such as the SAUNORIS Bloom Enhancer.

YELLOWING LEAVES

The most common problem for hibiscus is yellowing leaves. This is usually caused by sudden temp changes, over-watering or not enough sunlight.
